INTERNAL OPERATING PROCEDURE 2000-12

IN RE: FILING AND PROCESSING – LAND LINE CASES

In all cases involving a disputed boundary line and in which there is an issue as to the location of the land line, the plaintiff shall within sixty (60) days of the filing of the complaint have prepared and serve on the opposing parties a plat prepared by a registered land surveyor portraying clearly and with legal sufficiency the boundary line claimed by the plaintiff. Two copies of this plat should be provided to the opposing parties and within sixty (60) days of receiving same, the opposing parties should have superimposed on these two copies, with one to be returned to plaintiff's counsel, the boundary line claimed by defendant(s) marked clearly with legal sufficiency in a different color ink.
